At this dawning of Lent 2024...

Dearest friends of Christ Jesus our Lord,

I write to you today to invite you into a place PAS where "reversal" is BOTH <u>beautiful</u> and <u>needful</u> in our worship of God and our relationship with Christ Jesus who dwells amongst us in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Before going too deeply however, let me begin with exploring what I mean by "reversal" with you all. "Reversal" is a very good English usage of the idea beneath another term perhaps more familiar in "Christian-ese," that being the word "repentance." It is the notion that we are to reverse or "turn-around" from anything that fouls relationship with God. Anything that seduces us from an ease of being with God ... in conversation... in trust... in presence and communion... in vulnerability... reliant upon... forsaking any other... without hesitation... without reluctance... in childlike \* wonder... ANYTHING that keeps us from this state of being in faith are the things that "foul" relationship with God and lets be very clear here... these things are not neutral things in you or me. These things are the things that God's people from the very beginnings of the story we encounter in Genesis (literally "in the beginning") have called, seduced, deceived and destroyed God's people time and again.

These are the things that we let in to our lives...

These are the things in the presence of which we exist as a people behind enemy lines, living as we do in a creation that for this time exists in a state of rebellion against the God who created, sustains, and even actively continually works to redeem and heal.

These are the tools and weapons of our own rebellious hearts as we too live out that struggle between seeking righteousness and running far from it, for we too, each one of us, are prodigal children in our own rights.

We are the fertile soil in which all sin resides and takes stubborn root much like weeds invading a garden. As things like pride, arrogance, gluttony, sloth, apathy, dehumanization, self-centeredness, amongst a whole litany of other sins great and small take root within us. Though created in the "imago-Dei" (image of God) we are fallen and complicit in the brokenness on

display in this world. Uncomfortable as it may be, when presented with the proper "mirror" though, we can begin to see how evil works and how we are not allowed to think of our selves immune to these influences as though we are above such things.

It is uncomfortable and yet it is needful. It is needful because God who is Holy, isn't content to allow this fallen world to exist as fallen. Instead God actively works within the muck and mud of this rebellious reality to seek out and save those with heart to receive, eyes to see and ears to hear. God confronts and condemns within us that which is ugly and sinsoaked SO THAT we will no longer be trapped within that reality of our own participation. The Cross of Christ Jesus becomes then the mirror through which we can begin to see ourselves in truth... we are fallen and yet in Christ we are made wholly new!!! ...and here, true beauty IS revealed.

There is beauty in returning to God and being made whole. There is beauty in having our dirty rags exchanged for robes white as snow. There is beauty in coming to know God as "Abba" (Dad/Pops). There is beauty in coming to truly know Jesus as "friend." There is beauty in discarding the shackles that ever seek to re-bind us in broken despair as our Enemy continues to prowl seeking those whom he may devour. There is beauty in facing the reality as it exists in our own hearts and releasing to Jesus that He may reach within us and mold and shape us to His will as a potter shaping clay.
