## A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

God's Word is not Comfortable Christianity

Dearest friends,

Ezekiel 33:6 says this: But if the sentinel sees the sword coming and does not blow the trumpet, so that the people are not warned, and the sword comes and takes any of them, they are taken away in their iniquity, but their blood I will require at the sentinel's hand.

So by God's call and in keeping with God's mercy, I blow...

There is a virus that has infected much of Christianity in our day. It has to be with "who" will be listened to... who will arbitrate truth ultimately in our lives. Will it be Jesus... or will it be ourselves and the voice of our own perceptions. Before dismissing me too quickly... read on.

I recently was thinking about a passage that I'd expect you too have read previously. It comes from the gospel of Matthew, where we hear Jesus say, "Enter," through the narrow gate; for the gate is wide and the road is easy that leads to destruction, and there are many who take it. For the gate is narrow and the road is hard that leads to life, and there are few who find it." (Matthew 7:13-14)

Let me ask you a couple questions to ponder and I'd encourage you not to answer them too quickly, even should the answers you come to prove discomfiting.

When you reflect upon the "gate" to God... is it "wide" or is it "narrow?" When you reflect upon the road people travel is it one that is "wide" or "narrow" and where ultimately does the "wide road" seem to lead... towards "destruction" or towards "life?" Think of some of the common messages of our culture... "I'm ok, you're ok ... "

"You do you..."

"As long as no one gets hurt, what's the problem?" "Who's to judge..."

"Live with no regrets..."

What trajectory do you perceive these pointing towards? I perceive these near universally pointing towards ways of life of maximum "permissability" with few, if any real boundaries... what do you see? Should these messages become a frame for living? Are these messages that would direct you toward a life bounded within a will "greater" than yourself, or are they encouragements to live with no greater authority than your own desires? Are these expressions of a "wide" or "narrow" way to live?

Now let's take a look at some phenomena that have been marking Western Christianity (largely witnessed in Europe and America) for several decades.

If a pastor/priest teaches or preaches a message that could be understood as pro-life, pro-marriage, pro-traditional sexuality/sexual expression would this get heard as matters "rightly" belonging to the realms of faith, or are these ideas nothing but "politics" and "right-wing" at that?

How many of us have friends or children that have departed churches or even faith itself because it's "too restrictive?" How many of those reading this even now, have contemplated departure for this reason at some point in their faith journey?

Do we grow anxious with messages from pastors / priests that hold Jesus up as "the" way to God to the exclusion of any other more broadly defined "way?"

Are we more comfortable with a teaching on "Radical Inclusion" than with one in which Jesus "Saves Sinners?" Which of these gets the name "gospel" in our modern conversations?

Would you tend to agree or disagree with a statement of: "I think most religious people largely are trying to get to the same place and worshiping the same God."

If Scripture's word should contrast with something expressed in our culture as "just, right, or better," which is more likely to be defended or upheld amongst Christian persons in your experience? (for good insight into the issue... Who are the caricatured or derided? Who are upheld as "enlightened" or "informed?")

Friends, as I reflect upon these questions both cultural and related to faith, what I see is a fairly pervasive movement where Jesus' words (and by extension also God's Word) are being repudiated and rebuked with practices (our "living theology") that prefer ideas that dismiss Jesus as either "wrong" or worse, a "liar."

From pulpits, from church publications, from church websites across multiple denominational bodies the "way" to God is being declared in "broader and wider" terms to the point that many "post-Christians" wonder if being part of faith had any significant value with boundaries too restrictive, "detriments" to God's new ways of being with people today. This "virus" infects us as it is simply another form of the age-old sin rooted in rejecting God as our authority, rule, and norm of life. The resultant infection manifests itself firstly as individuals and then subsequently as a church, that today "knows better" and proclaims God in ways inconsistent with Scripture itself. This false "gospel" results in running further down a wide, broad path towards not only our own destruction, but also contributes to the destruction of those God calls us to love and in whose service we have been called to become "laborers" in God's "harvest" (Matthew 9:37).

Our Baptism links us into Christ's narrow way of death to sin. It is a sign of a promise that God is ever working to bring us along that path to life. Our faith is to wholeheartedly trust that he is our friend and ally in living this "death to sin" that is our suffering throughout this life until the day God brings the promise to completion on our Last Day.

Every day is a struggle to live in the "narrow way" of life, yet we are not alone in the struggle, for God has promised us his Holy Spirit to be our help, teacher, and source of faith. We do not walk with God by falsely broadening the path that is of God's creation... We walk by returning to the foundation of our faith in Christ and rely upon him to be our guide, our way, our truth and our life.. Knowing that in Him we have been imparted forgiveness of our sin for His sake!

Is there a "wide" path to God, or is Jesus to be trusted at his word? Who will you listen to? Will it be a voice that whispers sweet seductions to blaspheme God's goodness and trust one's own thinking as one falls further from God, OR the voice of the Good Shepherd whose voice is calling you onto a narrow road of life?

There is no third option according to Scripture. The voice of Jesus ever calls you home... Have faith in him, for in faith in Jesus, God declares you righteousness. Jesus is to be trusted. His are the words of eternal life... and perhaps it is time we stop inventing our own, for these will never be anything more than false hope. In Jesus alone you have life... His narrow road leads you home!
