A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

FROM THE

"Thy Word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path" ~Psalms 119:105

A WORD

Beloved,

How did you learn "how" to speak? I know this is a question that likely you've given about the same amount of thought to as I did when the question first crossed my path... "little" to "none" or at least "not much recently." And yet, it is actually a pretty significant question that has some connections to another question... "why do we read Scripture?"

So how was it that you learned "how" to speak? I suspect that for every one of you it has mostly to do with two primary dynamics.

- 1) You were spoken to...
- You were around people who spoke... you were immersed in hearing language as it was used.

Developmentally the capacity for language was born in you as words were given to you slowly and steadily over a long duration of time. Vocabulary was likely first used by family members and expanded upon over time by a whole host of others. Which over time began to connect with persons and eventually with concepts and events such that over time language is born in you as language is used around and towards you. You actually develop and continue to grow in your capacities over time the more immersed you are in the realm of language.

Why do we read Scripture?

It is the place where language, specifically the language of faith... of relationship with God, is offered to us and around us so that we can develop a capacity to speak this language ourselves. Scripture is both God's Word to us... literally addressed to us as would a parent address a child AS WELL as language into which we are called to be immersed so that we can develop the language of faith... the love language of a relationship with God.

Scripture is our "school of language" in which faith finds expression and vocabulary as we develop the capacity to speak this quite particular (and sometimes peculiar) language.

How would one "grow" in this capacity for "faith" language...

QUILTER'S GROUP


The Wooden Cross Quilter's Group continue to make beautiful quilts for Lutheran World Relief. You are invited to join us (see calendar on the bulletin
