

A MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

“So what are you?”... “I’m a _____...”
“So that means you’re a _____”

Hello again friends. Have you ever noticed in the kinds of things that fill our thoughts, interactions, airwaves, and “inter-webs” how many of these exchanges include elements of the dynamic above?

There’s many ways to respond to the first... “I’m a... man, woman, democrat, republican, Caucasian, non-binary etc... etc... etc... whatever speaks of our self-identification.

Culturally more and more though, there are widening gaps that are being created each time the exchange moves into the realm of the second part where the recipient of the information goes about loading it up with whatever they largely seem pre-disposed to allow the identity to mean.

“Oh so you’re a tree-hugger...”

“Oh so you’re a Nazi...”

“Oh so you have no boundaries and are immoral...”


“Oh so you are a hate-filled person..”

“Oh so you are “like me” so that means I feel safe.”

“Oh you are not like me, so I feel threatened by you.”

A couple things I notice...

1. Rarely is that “interpretation” terribly flattering...
2. Rarely is that “interpretation” terribly true in any objective sense
3. This “interpretive impulse” is not “owned and operated” by only one group or category of persons,



but seems pretty universal in its utility to folks of all sorts of backgrounds and thoughts.

4. This “interpretation” is often a pretty good reflection of our theology of “sin” and its ripples within the human experience.

I bring it up because in Baptism each and every one of us have received an identifier and a definite statement one is called to reflect upon daily...

“I’m a child of God.”

But don’t we grow fearful sometimes of what gets done with that information?

2022 SYNOD ASSEMBLY

The 2022 Synod Assembly will be Saturday, June 4, 9:00 AM—4:00 PM at Trinity Lutheran Church, Lynnwood. Participants will gather under the theme: **Abound in Hope**—May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing so that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (*Romans 15:13*)



At the assembly participants will tend to the business of the synod: receive reports, elect new synod council members, vote on constitutional changes and proposed resolutions, celebrate ministry anniversaries—and join in vibrant worship together.

During worship, an offering will be gathered for: Lutheran Community Services Northwest to support refugees (80%); and the Bishop's Caring Fund which supports rostered ministers needing financial assistance for scholarships, counseling, etc. (20%).

Pastor Eric Griffith, Jerry Booren and Betty Scott will be attending as Wooden Cross representatives.

Here's the thing folks. Jesus flat out told his disciples that the "world" WOULD revile them for following him. Families would splinter... neighbors would mistreat... powers would seek to bend them... ALL because they would be willing to stand and answer, "So what are you anyway?" with "I am a child of God, beloved and forgiven through Jesus."

We in the "west" (people who largely have only ever had experiences of being a Christian in a realm where it is generally safe to be so) have typically had little first hand experience of the blatant forms of animosity that comes about for professing Jesus. But perhaps too you've been noticing over the last several years that is beginning to shift. It may be shifting BUT we are yet called upon to confess our identity in Christ. We may not be able to "control" that interpretation of our identity BUT we do control whether we will make the profession of our identity in Christ in the first place.
